

What is a Physician Incentive Plan?

A Physician Incentive Program is any way IHN-CCO pays a provider or a group of providers. This may reduce or limit services that are provided to a member.

Physician Incentive Programs must follow Federal and State Rules. The payment cannot be based on not giving members services which are needed. These programs should make the service or quality of care being given better. Below there is more information on Physician Incentives Programs.

IHN-CCO has the following Physician Incentives:

Quality Metrics Incentives

OHA sets goals for CCO plans, to make your care better. If the CCO meets the goal, a bonus is then paid to the CCO. IHN-CCO shares some of that bonus with providers who helped reach the goal.

Alternative Payment Arrangements

Different types of payments that help bring services together. There are three types of alternative payment arrangements IHN-CCO has with providers. These include: capitation, service and quality based.

IHN-CCO **does not** require providers involved in a payment arrangement to carry stop loss coverage.

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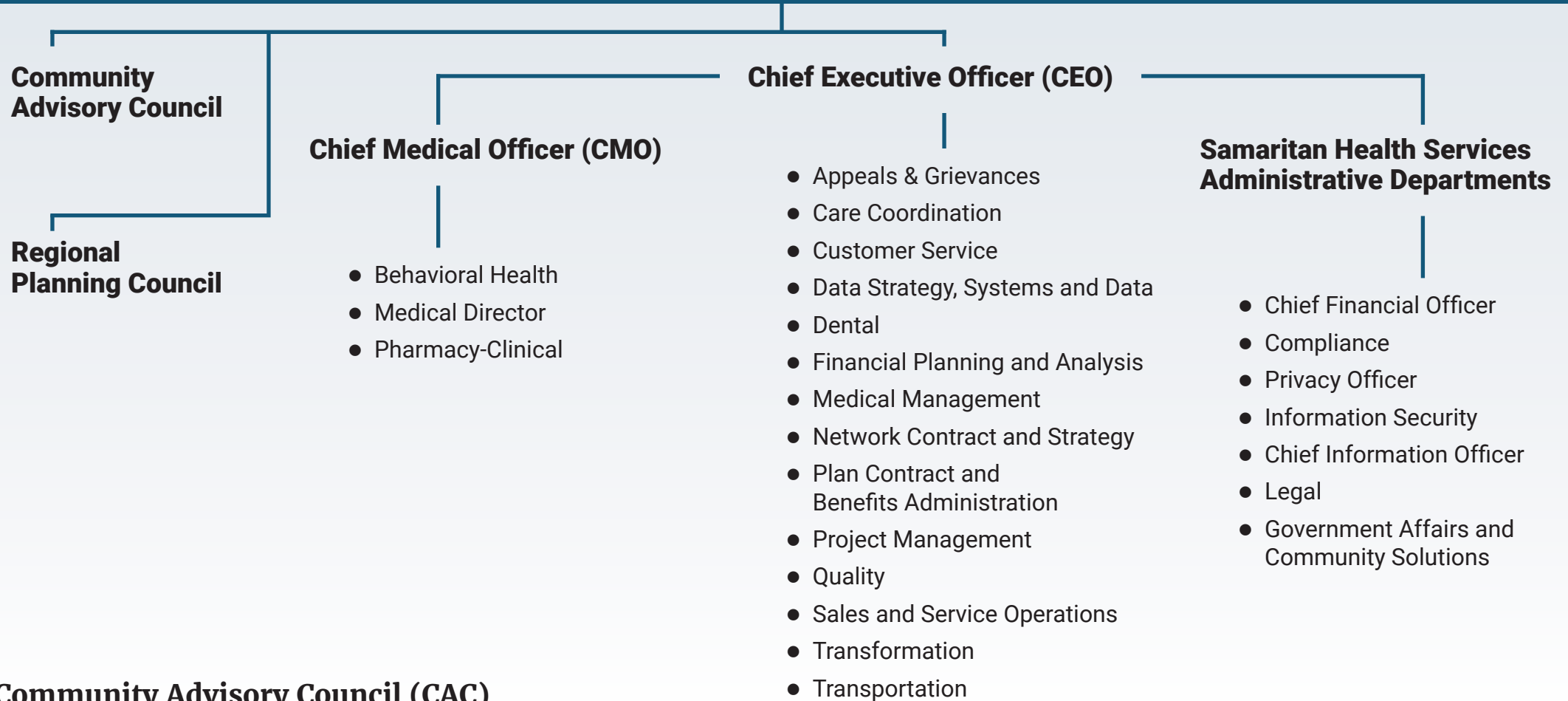

InterCommunity Health Network Coordinated Care Organization (IHN-CCO)

IHN-CCO Board of Directors

Council that makes up IHN-CCO. Made up of leadership, community and IHN-CCO members.



Community Advisory Council (CAC)

A group made up of OHP and community members. This group helps IHN-CCO achieve three goals: better health, better quality of care, and lower costs. These goals are put into in a Community Health Improvement Plan. This plan is given to OHA to show what IHN-CCO is doing to reach the goals.

Regional Planning Council (RPC)

A committee made up of leaders that meet regularly to plan ways to improve the health of the community. The leaders are from county health departments, IHN-CCO, the community, doctors, dentists and more.

IHN-CCO is a managed care plan. We work with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to provide health services to people enrolled in the Oregon Health Plan (OHP). IHN-CCO manages the medical, dental and behavioral health care for OHP members living in Benton, Lincoln, Linn and parts of Marion and Polk counties.
