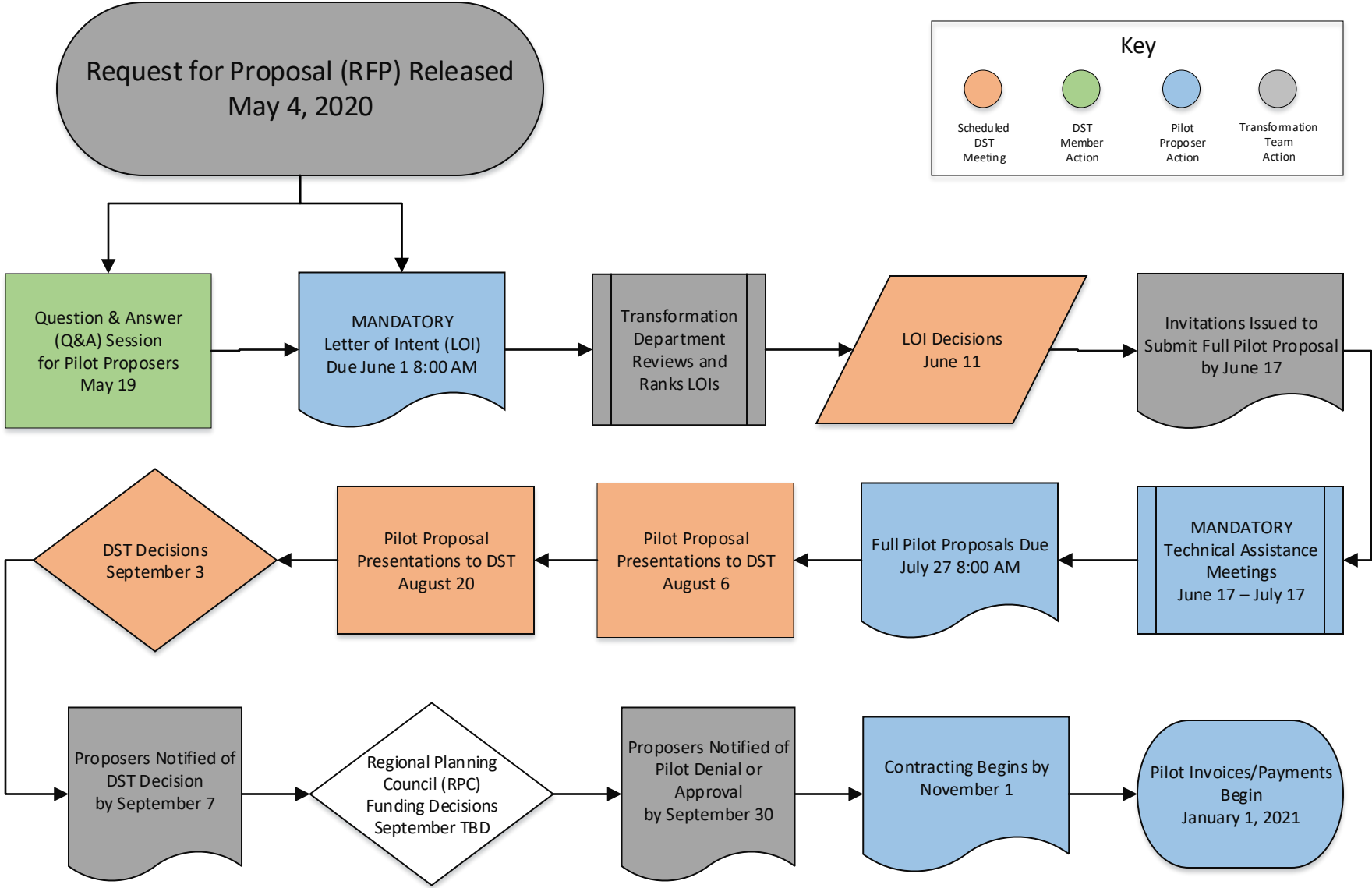

Transformation Update: Charissa Young-White

- The Bravery Center and Reduce and Improve pilots have requested extensions. Bravery Center originally was going to end December 2020. Reduce and Improve was set to end June 2020 and has requested a 6 month extension. See pages 8-9 of the packet for the request.
 - **DECISION:** Bravery Center extension approved by consensus.
 - **DECISION:** Reduce and Improve extension approved by consensus.
- The DST was originally chaired by an IHN-CCO leader and the co-chair was a community partner.
 - Two interested community partners have come forward so far.
 - If interested, please email Transformation by June 18, 2020.
 - Candidates will provide an update at the June 25, 2020 meeting.

Letter of Intent Review

- The score margin was very narrow; all letters had scores within six points of each other.
- Discussion around equity and bringing grassroots organizations to the table.
- Conversation centered around the ability to hear all proposers.
 - Transformation is able to handle the additional workload.
 - Will need to add August 13, 2020 as a DST meeting for proposals.
- Recommendation to provide information to the proposers about how much money is available for funding and how competitive it is.
- The DST would like to provide direction to all proposers.
- **DECISION:** Invite all submitters to submit a full pilot proposal.
 - August 13, 2020 will be added to the calendar.
 - All August 2020 meetings will be extended to 6:30 end time.
 - Transformation to send out a Survey Monkey to the DST for feedback to be provided at the time of technical assistance.
